**HOW TO LOOK AT THINGS**

On the wall of a restaurant in Red Creek, N. Y., there is this sign: "As you ramble on through life brother, whatever your goal, be sure you keep your eye on the doughnut and not on the hole!" This is the Christian way to look at the matter. Keep your eyes on life's positives and not on its negatives; on people's good points and not on their bad points. St. Paul puts the matter this way: "Whatever things are true, just, honorable, pure, gracious, and excellent, think on these things; and the God of peace will be with you." (Philipp. 4:8). Why? Because doing so is good and wholesome for the mind and heart and it will bring peace and be a blessing to yourself and others. Otherwise, looking on the negative side of life — on its evils — will bring critical — mindedness and strife into your life and that of others.

Another Christian way to look at people and things is to see them in terms of their inner significance, instead of their outer. It is not true that "it is what's out front that counts." It's what is going on inside that counts. Samuel the prophet was warned by the Lord when he was about to choose a king for Israel: "Do not look on his appearance; for the Lord sees not as man sees; for man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." (I Sam. 16:7). In the 1930's a juke box number pointed out this truth thus: "Laughing on the outside, but crying on the inside."

If we are Christian enough, we are to look at people from God's point of view, said St. Paul: "From now on, therefore, we look at no one from the human point of view, but from God's point of view." (2 Cor. 5:16-18). From the Christian point of view, we are children of God, born to carry out His purposes in our lives, no matter what our other functions. We are more than workers, teachers, nurses, doctors, lawyers, farmers or business people.
