A discussion concerning the Tax Assessment and interest in to 100% valuation for the Town of Andover in the near future. If the Town goes to 100% valuation, the State Aid would increase and the rate would be lowered.

They were going to build a levee around the Big N Plaza but the majority of the meeting was against this levee. They discussed check dam in Andover Area to control the volume of water.

Max Baker Superintendent of HWY informed the Board that the Greenan Road was nearly completed, and are going to seal off the Rochambeau Ave., Ext., and the lower end of East Valley this week.

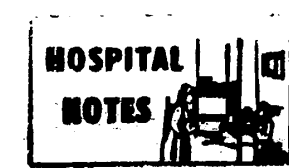
