AN UPDATE ON THE BOND ISSUE

Listed on the November 8, ballot will be a proposal to allow the state government to arrange for \$150-million in borrowing to fund projects across New York State.

When the Bond Issue proposal was considered on the Assembly Floor, I and other Assembly Republicans requested that a formal, legal list of projects be enacted as part of the proposal to be presented to the voters.

The idea of the constant changing of the list seems to be to offer a little bit for everybody in order to entice voters to support the concept, and then, after it is approved by the voters, to ramrod still another list of politically advantageous projects through the Legislature which would actually be carried out.

More information on the way projects would be funded is also beginning to surface. From the current list of projects we find there are almost no hard state dollars, only state borrowing, while local communities and the federal government are expected to come up with large shares of project funding.
