This is an opportunity for all of you with some entertainment ability to show your talent — so please don't be bashful — this might launch your career.

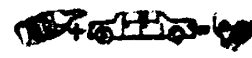
From Our Files

Dewey's Tax Program which permits the County to levy special local sales taxes, gasoline taxes and automobile ownership taxes for the purpose of raising funds to support the minimum teacher salary increase as set up by the State and which are mandatory.
