Rev. and Mrs. Howard Gabriel Host Open House At Methodist Parsonage

The Rev. Howard Gabriel and his wife, June were host and hostess for an Open House, Sunday October 23 at the Andover United Methodist parsonage from 2 - 5 p. m. They were assisted by Mrs. Hazel Burgett and others of the church.

The occasion for the Open House was the recent completion of an extensive renovation of the interior of the Andover parsonage by the United Methodists of Andover and Greenwood, who constitute one parish. The manner in which the renovation was handled and accomplished was anything but routine.

This past February, when their minister was transferred unexpectedly, the two congregations found their parsonage empty for the first extended period of time in many years. A new full-time minister was not scheduled to arrive until July. It was apparent that more than routine repairs had to be made on the parsonage interior when the committee in charge looked over the work to be done in addition they found that there was a real need for insulating the parsonage.

The necessary funds to do the extensive work required were not on hand. The solution and a plan for doing it came from Daniel and Lee Spangler of the Andover church. Dan Spangler volunteered to act as the prime contractor for the work. Volunteer sub-contractors with talents for certain categories of work were recruited from the congregations, and each of them got volunteer talent from church members to help with each task. Another member, Alan Tuttle was then appointed to be finance chairperson, to take care of the work of getting the necessary funds.

Thus, operation "Parsonage Repair" got underway this past March. Several hundred hours of work by the men and ladies of the churches were donated. Walls were insulated, old gas lines removed, painting and papering done wiring rerouted, walls paneled, closets built, ceilings lowered, heating ducts rerouted, bathrooms remodeled, carpeting redone and cleaned, plus many other necessary tasks. Before the fund drive was over more than two thousand dollars were raised over the regular budgets of the two churches.

Among the "sub-contractors" who helped meet the June completion date were: Harley Glover, Kenneth Cook, Ralph Burgett, Duane Cook, Bill Smith, Bill Connor, and other members of the Andover United Methodist women's society got the cleaning done and put the parsonage in good order for the new minister and his wife before their arrival July 1. Rev. Howard and June Gabriel, the new occupants are comfortably at home in the renovated parsonage, thanks to the sacrificial efforts of the Andover and Greenwood United Methodist people.
