

Village Board Holds Monthly Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Trustees was held in the Village Office, Monday evening, October 10th at 7:30. Those present: Ralph A. Allen, Mayor; Karl Graves, Ann Appier and Charles Dain, Trustees. Richard Moran, Electrical Engineer.

Minutes of the regular meeting held September 12th were read and approved on a motion made by Karl Graves and seconded by Charles Dain.

Minutes of the special meeting held September 26th were read and approved on a motion made by Charles Dain and seconded by Karl Graves.

Richard Moran, Village Electric Engineer, was present to discuss several topics with the Board. He reported that the Village has completed its responsibility as far as the Raykovitz Electric is concerned. A survey by Stuart & Howard surveyors, was completed and established that the property of Frank Raykovitz is within the Village, therefore must be serviced by the Village. Mr. Moran has made an agreement with Niagara Mohawk to install a borderline service, whereby Niagara Mohawk will supply power to the Raykovitz residence, and bill the Village. The Village will pay Niagara Mohawk, and bill Frank Raykovitz at Village Rates. The property records for the Village Electric Department are being brought up to date as required by the Power Authority. Mr. Moran also reported that we must have a revised rate schedule and conditions of service as to installation of service. This policy must be set by the Mayor and Board of Trustees and be executed by the Clerk who will handle all correspondence to the Power Authority. This policy will be set up in the near future and sent to the Power Authority for approval. Mr. Moran reported that a formal application has been made to the Power Authority for an increase in contract demand of contract NS3 with the Power Authority.

Police Sergeant Robert Strimple was given Board approval to attend a one-day seminar to be held in Buffalo, October 18th with expenses to be paid by the Village.

Due to inclement weather the Village has asked for an extension of time to complete the water line project on West Greenwood St. This request was sent to the County Manpower Program.

Moved by Karl Graves and seconded by Ann Appier, to issue a building permit to Joyce Management Corp. to build a house on the Joe Lynch Road.

Robert Chaffee, P.E. presented a building application to the Board for Viru Trowbridge to build a home on Rt. 417. This will be turned over to Harold Joyce Building Inspector and acted on in the near future.

Julie Tidd and Denise Billings were present and presented a letter signed by the residents of Baker St. Extension to have the road repaired as far as Kenneth Tidd's which is the Village responsibility, as the road is in bad shape and winter weather will make it worse.

Moved by Ann Appier, and seconded by Charles Dain, to accept the resignation of Fred Middaugh from the Board of Trustees. Mr. Middaugh has moved from the area.

Mayor Ralph A. Allen appointed Howard McAndrew to fill the unexpired term of Fred Middaugh. Mr. McAndrew served on the Village Board from April 1951 to April 1967. The appointment was endorsed unanimously by Board Members.

As of January 1, 1978 all units of local government will be covered under the New York State Unemployment Insurance Law. Moved by Charles Dain and seconded by Karl Graves, to elect the Benefit Reimbursement Method instead of the contribution tax method.

This is to confirm that a final coordination meeting for the Flood Insurance Study of the Village of Andover, New York has been scheduled for Monday, November 21, 1977 at 1:00 p. m., at the Village Office, 4 Main Street, Andover New York.

The purpose of this meeting is to present the results of HUD's Flood Insurance Study to the community in draft form, and to solicit comments on the study's findings from community officials and interested citizens.

Your community's comments will be forwarded to our Central Office for review together with the draft study report. Following this review there will be a 90 day period during which individual property owners may appeal the findings of the study.

After the study is finalized and the review and appeals process has been completed, your community will be converted to the Regular Phase of the National Flood Insurance Program. At this time the Community will be required to take some additional Flood Plain Management measures based on the findings of the Flood Insurance Study. HUD's representative at the meeting will discuss in detail both the Insurance and the Flood Plain Management aspects of the community's conversion to the Regular Phase of the program.

A representative of the study contractor will present the study report and will be available to answer your questions. We have recently forwarded draft copies of this report to you and we suggest that community officials review the report and prepare questions on the study findings prior to the meeting.

We would appreciate your making an effort to inform the community of the time, place and purpose of this meeting so that all interested parties will have an opportunity to attend.

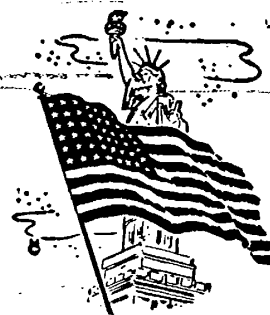

Legion Observes Veterans Day In Local Ceremony

Lynch-Burgett Post No. 397, The American Legion, observed the Traditional Veterans Day in simple services held at the Andover Central School on Friday, November 11, 1977.

The program consisted of the Andover Central School Band under the leadership of Mrs. Nancy Potter, playing a march for the advancement of The Colors; Harold Rice, 1st Vice Commander then introduced Ralph A. Allen, Acting Chaplain, who led the group with prayer; Frank McCormick, Post Commander, then greeted the Assembly and in turn introduced "Mike" Brace as speaker.
