Mrs. Florence Moore returned home from the St. James Mercy Hospital, Wednesday.

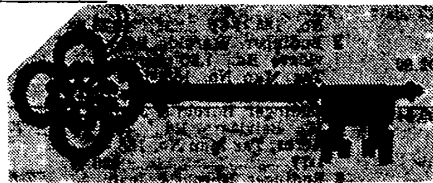
