Arranged by the college's Office of Continuing Education in conjunction with the National Safety Council and New York State Department of Motor Vehicles, the course will be taught by William Moss, supervisor with the department of public safety at Alfred State College.

Persons successfully completing the course may earn three credit points to counter penalty points received against their driver's license according to Dr. Ronald Cushman, director of continuing education.
